
Directions and Travel Tips

Dublin Castle is located in the centre of Dublin. Erected in the early thirteenth century on the site of a Viking settlement, Dublin Castle served for centuries as the headquarters of English, and later British, administration in Ireland. In 1922, following Ireland's independence, Dublin Castle was handed over to the new Irish government. It is now a major government complex and a key tourist attraction. The EAC symposium venue - the Hibernia Conference Centre – is at the centre of the complex.

Map of Dublin Castle:





How to Get To Dublin Castle from the airport:


Dublin Airport has two terminals located only a 2 minute walk from each other. The Airlink bus is the best way to get to Dublin Castle from the airport and presently fares are €7 for a single fare or €12 return to nearby Lord Edward Street. Once you get through customs and luggage pick-up you arrive at the arrivals hall, and outside the exit door you will find the stop for the Airlink Express bus, #747.

Tickets can be purchased [online](#) or at the Bus and Travel Information desk at the Arrivals Hall in Dublin Airport in Terminal 1. If you arrive into Terminal 2 it only takes two minutes to walk to Terminal 1 through the covered walkway.

Tickets can also be bought from the vending machines located outside Terminal 1 and Terminal 2, or from any of the Airlink Sales Promoters in the Green jackets.



It is a 3 min walk to Dublin Castle from the Airlink bus stop at Lord Edward St. See map below; from the bus stop, walk back in the direction of City Hall and take a right at Cork Hill which will lead to the Corkhill Gate through to Dublin Castle. Walk through the Corkhill Gate into the courtyard of Dublin Castle and turn right for the Hibernia Conference Centre (No. 9 on the map of Dublin Castle above).



A taxi from the airport will take approximately 35 minutes, pending traffic and cost approximately €30.
